Ms. Sellers reported the town was awarded \$11,635.00 which will be used for free dumpster days (\$2,600.00), town cleanup activities (\$1,950.00), youth group for cleanup activities (\$1,500.00) promotional reusables (\$1,875.00), plaza plants (\$2,100.00), graffiti removal (\$350.00), fiesta interns (\$1,260.00)

b) Mesilla Community Center Infrastructure Capital Improvement Plan (ICIP) – Rod McGillivray Mr. McGillivray reviewed the Community Center ICIP which is the same as last year: floors, grease trap, replace backdoors, AC units. The town received a letter of support from Adelante.

Mayor Pro Tem Johnson-Burick stated for clarification, the solid waste increase is based on the CPI and not on new contract with Southwest Disposal.

Mayor Barraza responded the CPI is at 7.48% this year.

Mr. McGillivray stated the Mesilla Valley contract was transferred to Southwest Disposal.

Mayor Barraza stated rates have been increased according to the CPI in past years. We will be out of town Tuesday thru Saturday. Ms. Sellers is getting ready for the fiesta.
